A great Regional Councilor he will be!

As I sat through numerous recitals and master classes at the Region I Convention for three days, I realized that my first Chiff Chat article finally had a face. From the truly fabulous recital by Paul Jacobs, whose playing was breathtakingly thrilling, to Dame Gillian Weir's equally exciting all French program on the stunning 126 rank Cassavant at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul, to numerous workshops, it was a packed 3 days. Nine recitals tucked around workshops and panel discussions on just about every appropriate topic treated 150 AGO members to plenty of inspiration and food for thought.

For all of us it was a chance to connect to other church musicians, a rare opportunity in our work!
